Augusta, Ga.

March 12th, 1918.

Dear Mother and Dad;

For several days I have not received a letter from home. Perhaps the mail has been held up. Sunday I received a letter from Cousin Ida with another Smilege book. I certainly have been well remembered with them.

This last two days have been much cooler, but it is getting warm again. Last night I was over to the Y M. C. A. and heard Congressman Fest, speak. He is chairman of Committee of Foreign Affairs. He delivered a wonderful speech and certainly touched the patriotism of the boys very much.

Secretary Lansing, Sec. of State has been reviewing part of our camp and troops every day. Camp Hancock again leads the Health Record with only 15 sickness. The Secretary complimented the officials on the clean camp and spirit of the men.

This visit certainly will help us to get across and politics are now being put aside to push ahead this division.
