Augusta, Ga.

March 5th, 1918.

Dear Mother and Dad;

Received your letter tonight but I have not much news in return. Things are rather dull here.

Tonight I am on Guard, and again on Saturday night. Tomorrow night I am going to a private dance with two other friends expect to have a fine time. Some more rumors. There is supposed to be a Fourth Officers Training Camp. If there is, we will be here to July. I hardly think this is possible but we never can tell.

To-day I washed a bunch of clothes and took a bath. Nearly every day I take a bath and it is mostly cold water.

Last week I wrote a dandy letter to Aunt Mamie I hope I get an answer. I am going to close now for lack of news.
