

Each Autumn, the Foundation invites our members, donors, and business partners for an evening "at the museum"--dinner at the U.S. Army Heritage and Education Center, a silent auction, and a very special awards presentation.

In 2024, we're honoring former Pennsylvania Governor Tom Corbett for his career-spanning support of and advocacy for the military community.

On the eve of their 250th anniversary (November 17, 1774), we're presenting our Living Legend Award to the First Troop Philadelphia City Cavalry--the oldest surviving military unit in the United States.

In April 1980, the secretive joint operations rescue mission of 52 American hostages held in the U.S. Embassy in Tehran, Iran ended in catastrophe. A destructive desert sandstorm. Eight dead service members. No rescued hostages. It was a deadly failure. The Ayatollah called it an act of God.

Operation Eagle Claw was one of Delta Force's first operations. But it has almost become known as one of the biggest catastrophes in special forces history. What happened that day?
