-Ike as a Pilot

Dwight D. Eisenhower dallied with flying twice during his military career. Prior to World War I and before his marriage, young Lieutenant Eisenhower applied for a transfer from the Infantry Branch to the Army's Aviation Section. However, when approved on the eve of his marriage, he refused the transfer at the insistence of his prospective father-in-law. Two decades later, while assisting with the training of the fledgling Philippine Air Corps, Major Eisenhower not only took flying lessons but also received a license. See:
