**NOTE-Termination of War Department Jurisdiction, 1877**

The transfer of jurisdiction and responsibility in Alaska from the War Department to the Treasury Department was agreed upon in an exchange of formal letters, dated 17 and 24 March 1877, between Secretary of War George W. McCrary and Secretary of the Treasury John Sherman. Copies of these exchanges are in the National Archives (Records of the Office of the Adjutant General, Microcopy M666, Reel #358), according to the footnotes of the Lain study cited below.

Once the mutual agreement had been reached at the departmental level and President Hayes approved it, the Army withdrew from its Alaskan garrisons at Sitka and Fort Wrangel, coordinating the exodus with the arrival of Treasury officers and a revenue cutter. Orders to this effect appeared in the Army's Division of the Pacific and Department of the Columbia in April and May 1877. The last Army troops departed Alaska 16 June 1877. See.
