Prior to 1909, no troops of the black 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> US Cavalry were stationed in Alaska, nor was the black 25<sup>th</sup> US Infantry in that territory. However, Company L of the 24<sup>th</sup> US Infantry was there from 15 May 1899 to 20 May 1902. See:
