COMPANY vs BATTERY DESIGNATION

We have been unable to determine precisely when artillery companies were first referred to as "batteries". In the Adjutant General Department's <u>Subject Index of the General Orders of the War Department</u>, 1809-1860, artillery "companies" are cited. The earliest reference to <u>batteries</u> found was in War Dept <u>General Order 16</u>, (15 Apr 1847).

Willard L. Jones in his draft study, "History of the Organization of United States Field Artillery", (Wash, DC, OCMH, n.d.), page 99, indicates artillery regiment reorganization on 29 July 1861 required that companies be redesignated as batteries.
