#### **NOTE: U.S. ARMY SECURITY FOR FT. KNOX GOLD**

According to the NY Times (13 Jan 1937) p. 48 and (14 Jan 1937), p. 23, the 7<sup>th</sup> Cavalry Brigade (Motorized) participated in guarding the transfer of U.S. gold bullion from the Philadelphia mint to its new home within Ft. Knox, KY. The uniformed troops augmented civilian guards.
