WORLD WAR I

Numerous World War I memoirs and other literary forms contain accounts of ghosts on the Western Front. The most famous mass vision was of the Angels of Mons, witnessed by retreating British soldiers in August 1914. Once the war settled into static but tense trench warfare, individual encounters with apparitions became common, particularly in No Man's Land. Robert Graves, cited below, tells of one case at Bethune. A passing reference to discussion of ghosts is found on page 156 of Edmund Blunden's Undertones of War (London: Oxford U, 1956; D640B63). Blunden himself met a spy or a ghost shortly before an attack (p. 115). One may find similar French examples in Henri Barbusse's memoir/novel Under Fire (NY: Dutton, 1917; PZ3B234). As an example of Great War poetry with a ghostly theme, see "Strange Meeting" by Wilfred Owen. And for discussions of Great War "supernormal" phenomena, see Hereward Carrington's Physical Phenomena and the War, NY: Dodd, Mead, 1918; D639P8C3.
