The battle for Pork Chop Hill actually comprised a series of actions in 1952 & 1953. The most intensive fighting involved three separate occasions in March, April and July 1953. The best known action occurred 16-18 Apr 1953, largely from coverage in S.L.A. Marshall's book, cited below, and the 1959 United Artists' *Pork Chop Hill*, starring Gregory Peck.
