Handwritten official correspondence, 145 p. Most letters deal with efforts to return Kickapoos, Lipans and Mescalero Apaches from Mexico to the US and to pacify the Rio Grande frontier, May-Aug 1873. Principal correspondents were GEN Philip Sheridan, Division of the Missouri; GEN Christopher Augur, Dept. of Texas; LTC William Shafter, 24<sup>th</sup> U.S. Infantry; Thomas G. Williams and Henry M. Atkinson, US special envoys; William Schuhardt, US consul at Piedras Negras, Mexico; and Vittoriano Cepeda, Governor of Coahuila.
