ARMY AND AIR MAIL

Army Air Corps briefly carried US air mail, 19 Feb-1 Jun 1934, after existing contracts with commercial operators were declared illegal and annulled. Unprepared and with obsolete equipment, the Army performed less than satisfactory as a carrier, even a stopgap one. See:
