ORGANIZATION

The 8213th Army Unit, organized in Japan, 25 Aug 1950, became known informally as the Eighth Army Ranger Company, while attached to 25th Infantry Division. In Mar 1951, the unit was deactivated. Meanwhile, fourteen ranger companies were formed in the U.S., six of which went as infantry units to divisions in Korea. They were deactivated by Sep 1951. Thereafter, ranger training of infantry units substituted for actual ranger units. Reference:
