## **THE DUKW**

DUKW = U.S. Army conventional vehicle descript codes gave this amphibious truck its name:  
**D** (1942); **U** (amphibian); **K** (all-wheel drive); **W** (dual rear axles). Build on a 1-1/2 ton 6x6  
truck chases, the 7-ton DUKW could transport 25 men on land or 50 while afloat, or 5,000  
pounds of general cargo.. Its name and its nature combined to make "duck" an inevitable  
nickname.
