PERSONAL PAPERS

Abrams, Creighton W. CO, 37th Tank Battalion, CCB, 4th Armored Division, ca. 1942-45. Oral history transcripts of interviews with Abrams' associates. Several, such as those of Bruce C. Clarke and DeWitt Smith, deal with his service with the 4th Armored Division in WWII.

Adams, Paul. ADC, 45th Infantry Division, 1944-45. Oral history transcript on career; section 3, pp. 40-41, 43-45 provides material on effect of 4th Armored Division operating on flank of 45th Infantry Division in late German campaigns in WWII.

Armor-4th Division. Miscellaneous after-action reports, reminiscences of division veterans (including Gen. Pattison's memoir on relief of General Wood), and historical summaries of division in WWII. 1 box.

Armor-66th Regiment (Battalion). 1940-67. Retained copy of official reports of 66th Armored Regiment and 1st Battalion, 66th Armored Regiment, including some documents from parent organizations, 2nd and 4th Armored Divisions. 17 boxes.

Clarke, Bruce C. CO, 24th Engineer Battalion (Armored), Chief of Staff, and CO, CCA, 4th Armored Division, 1942- 44. Oral history transcripts covering career and personal papers. Two separate efforts in MHI/AWC OH program in addition to Abrams project (see above). Numerous papers scattered through collection allude to WWII experiences to illustrate points made on training, doctrine, organization, and operations. 13 boxes.

Columbus WWII Round Table-- Furman Allen. Officer, Message Center, 144th Armored Signal Company, 4th Armored Division, 1942-44. Brief memoir of service with the division while it was stationed in England. 3 pp.

Columbus WWII Round Table-- Waldo R. Mowen, Jr. Personnel Officer, 51st Armored Infantry Battalion, 4th Armored Division, ca. 1944-45. Memoir (5pp.) and completed questionnaire.

Crittenberger, Willis D. Chief of Staff, 1st Armored Division, 1940-41, CG, 2nd Armored Division and III Armored Corps, 1941-43. Retained copies of official papers and text of memoirs written by associates at Ft. Knox concerning creation of the earliest armored divisions of the WWII era. ca. 17 boxes.

Dager, Holmes E. CG, CCB, 4th Armored Division, 1944-45. Retained copies of official papers, after-action reports. 1 box.

Field Artillery--US--94th Battalion. 94th Armored Field Artillery Battalion, 4th Armored Division, 1944-45. Unofficial operational log, newspaper story, unit historical sketch. 1 box.

Hoge, William M. CG, 4th Armored Division, 1945. Oral history transcript on career. Section 3, pp. 12-13, 15-20, covers service with 4th Armored Division, but transcript contains several illustrations from WWII which do not follow in chronological sequence, and so other references are possible. 1 box.

MacDonald, Charles B. Historian. Research notes for the book A Time for Trumpets, includes a folder on 4th Armored Division. Many notes in this collection are photocopies of historical summaries and other documents from Record Group 407 in the National Archives. Other material consists chiefly of correspondence with WWII veterans.

Pattison, Hal. XO, CCA, 4th Armored Division, 1943-45, Chief of Military History, ca. 1963-70. Includes unit history, documents, articles on 4th Armored Division in WWII and 1960s, and some correspondence with John S. ("P") Wood in early 1960s (see also folder in "Armor--4th Armored Division" for recollections of Pattison on the relief of Wood.). 2 boxes.
