10th Armored Division

The 10th Armored Division, nicknamed the "Tiger Division," was activated on 15 July 1942, at Fort Benning, Georgia. After undergoing training and participation in the 1943 Tennessee Maneuvers, the division deployed to the European Theater of Operations (ETO). The division returned to the United States on 13 October 1945 and was deactivated that same date at Camp Patrick Henry, Virginia.

Organized as a "light" armored division, the 10th Armored Division evolved around three tank battalions containing 245 light and medium tanks. Each tank battalion contained three medium tank companies and one light tank company. Light armored divisions also had three armored infantry battalions, each consisting of a headquarters and headquarters company, a service company and 3 armored rifle companies.
