1st Cavalry Division

During World War II a cavalry division consisted of a headquarters, a headquarters troop, a cavalry reconnaissance squadron (Mechanized), two cavalry brigades, a division artillery, an engineer squadron, a medical squadron, a division artillery, an ordnance medium maintenance company, a quartermaster squadron, a signal troop, and a military police platoon.

A generic cavalry brigade consisted of a headquarters and headquarters troop and two cavalry regiments. In 1942 each cavalry regiment consisted of a regimental headquarters and band, a headquarters troop, a service troop, a weapons troop, and two rifle squadrons. On 30 September 1944 a typical cavalry regiment underwent a reorganization after which it consisted of a headquarters and headquarters troop, a service troop, a weapons troop, and two rifle squadrons.

Initially, each rifle squadron consisted of a squadron headquarters and three rifle troops. Later, the squadron was reorganized and consisted of a headquarters and headquarters detachment and three rifle troops. Then, in late 1943 Weapons Troops D and H were added to each regiment (one per squadron).
